










Timetable layout is APPROXIMATE and is published only to give you guidance to plan your day. Accurate class start times are published from 7th September.

Team Holder Training Classes: A chance to run through the format of the type of the class that you've entered, familiarise your horse/pony with the showground and receive valuable feedback from a experienced judges, who will guide you through the whole process. Competitors are encouraged to present themselves in show gear, fully 'turned out' but neatly presented in 'normal' tack and attire is permitted. Boots/bandages may be worn.

Endeavour Awards: All training classes are part of the Team Holder Endeavour Awards Scheme. In each class an Endeavour Awards award is presented to recognise and reward competitors who demonstrate qualities like exceptional effort, perseverance, determination, potential talent, good conduct and ring etiquette. Team Holder will present the winner of the award with a unique certificates and sponsored prizes.

Showing Foundations Championship: A new introductory level championship for novice competitors just getting started in showing. The judging is influenced by performance, manners, style and presentation rather how posh your gear is! Blemishes will not affect judging. The format and individual show will be advised by the judge on the day, no group canter is required and assistance is permitted – leading or accompanying in the ring. If you fancy a go at showing, this fun class is for you. All the championship bling as well as rosettes for all.

Novice & Newcomer Championships: A set of championship classes for novice competitors and those new to showing. Classes follow a simplified format but follow the traditional lines of showing. There's a class for everyone – Lead Rein & First Ridden, In-Hand & Ridden, Working Hunter Pony and Working Hunter. Turnout should be as traditional as possible, but specialist gear is not required. Competitors are required to be independent, except for lead rein classes. Ridden classes will feature an individual show, rather than judge riding and strip & trot up is included if time. If you're stepping in the showing world, but not yet fully accomplished, the Novice & Newcomer classes offer the perfect gateway to the showing world.

Celebration of British Native Breeds: A special feature to honour and recognise the versatility of our wonderful British breeds. Participants can acquire points for placings in dressage and jumping (show jumping or eventers challenge) on Thursday, Friday & Saturday. The final points will be awarded in a ridden showing class on Sunday. For this unique championship, kindly sponsored by National Pony Society, points make prizes and the winners will take home truly unique prizes and be crowned champion of the British Native Breeds at the Sunshine Tour!
